

Aqua America Chairman and CEO Appointed to Chesapeake Bay Watershed Blue Ribbon Finance Panel

BRYN MAWR, Pa.--(BUSINESS WIRE)--March 11, 2004--Nicholas DeBenedictis, Aqua America, Inc., (formerly Philadelphia Suburban Corporation) chairman and chief executive officer has been selected by Pennsylvania Governor Edward G. Rendell to serve on the new Chesapeake Bay Watershed Blue Ribbon Finance Panel. The panel of high-level business leaders, financial and economic experts, government officials and regional leaders will provide guidance to the Chesapeake Executive Council on funding the multi-state effort to restore the Chesapeake Bay.

"I am honored that the Governor saw fit to appoint me to this committee," said DeBenedictis. "As a former Secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources and a representative of both the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and a national water utility I am fully committed to support the Council's efforts of watershed preservation and look forward to working with this distinguished group of panel members. The 15-member panel was selected by the Mayor of the District of Columbia and the Governors of Delaware, Maryland, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia, along with members of the Chesapeake Bay Commission and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
